

Don't get caught off guard in case of a medical emergency, have a doctor on hand that you can trust!

#### ... How to Find a Primary Care Physician...

It's often thought that primary care physicians can only practice internal medicine, but that is not always the case. If you have found a good doctor, such as a local dermatologist or nose ear and throat doctor, who you feel comfortable discussing your personal health with, that practitioner can also be considered a primary care physician. Here are some ways to help find a trusted doctor for you:

- Don't be afraid to check out local clinics in your neighborhood, or around your office. Take advantage of the opportunity to receive regular check-ups and find a good primary care physician.
- ② Make use of the prefecture's [Emergency Medical Care Net Hiroshima: <u>http://www.qq.pref.hiroshima.jp</u>] to find information about practitioners in your area.
- ③ Emergency Consultation Service for the Hiroshima Regional Urban Area (# #7119) This phone service is open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year and offers to help match callers with good doctors in their area. The service is free; however, cell phone provider rates may apply. If you cannot get through, please use this number: # 246-2000

Things to keep in mind when visiting a physician for the first time:

- What is the doctor's communication style?
- o Did they take the time to listen to your questions and answer them patiently?
- Did the doctor explain things to you in a way that you could understand?
- Would you feel comfortable talking to them about sensitive or personal health issues?

#### Don't Wait to See a Doctor

Due to the increased worry about catching COVID-19, many individuals are refraining from visiting a doctor. However, putting off your symptoms might have other health risks. Don't wait, speak with your primary care physician today.
