## **Special Temporary Benefits to Families with Children**

Kosodate-setai Rinji Tokubetsu Kyūfu

子育て世帯への臨時特別給付(P6)

Special, temporary funding for households with children (Kosodate-setai Rinji Tokubetsu Kyūfu) is available for qualified individuals. Allowance fee is 100,000 yen per child. Individuals who are currently raising high school aged children must apply by February 28th, 2022 in order to receive the benefits. Please see the city's website for more details including who is eligible for the benefits and how to apply.

## **Special Allowance for Low-income Households**

Jūminzei Hi-kazei Setai-tō Rinji Tokubetsu Kyūfukin

住民税非課税世帯などへの給付金(P2)

Special allowance, of up to 100,000 yen per household, for those who have faced hardships due to COVID-19 to help with living expenses. Specifically targeted towards households that were exempt from resident taxes for the 2021 fiscal year or those with sudden financial issues. Please contact the office below for more details including who is eligible for the benefits and how to apply.

## Processing office for special allowance for tax-exempt households and those with sudden financial issues

(Jūminzei Hi-kazei Setai-tō Rinji Tokubetsu Kyūfukin Jimu Sentā)

Hours of Operation: 9:00 am - 5:15 pm

♦ The office is closed on Sat., Sun., and national holidays.

#### Please keep in mind the following:

- The only individuals who are eligible to receive this allowance are those outlined in category I or II mentioned below. It is a one-time allowance of 100,000 yen to a single household, you cannot receive both.
- Please be aware that when all household members are claimed as dependents by the person who is subject resident tax, the household is not eligible to receive this allowance even if they fall below category I or II.

#### Category I: Tax exempt households

Requirements: Households where all members were registered as Hiroshima city residents as of December 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021 and were exempt from resident taxes (flat rate) (住民税均等割 *Jūminzei Kintō Wari*) in the 2021 fiscal year

I-(A) All family members within the household have been living in the city before January 1st, 2021

Applying: After receiving a letter from the City Hall, verifying confirmation and detailing the

contents of the allowance, check all necessary fields and send back if required.

Schedule: The City Hall will begin sending out forms of confirmation with more information in February. Allowance will be provided sequentially to the households once the

confirmation process is completed.

## I-(B) Either all members or someone in the household who have transferred to Hiroshima City after January 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2021

Applying: An application form needs to be submitted to receive the benefits. To receive the

form, either visit the city's home page, or contact the office below. (They will send

you the required forms by mail.)

Schedule: The office will begin processing applications from Monday, February 21st.

#### Category II: Households with sudden financial issues

Requirements: Households that the average income from January 2021 has fallen, and qualified

them for tax exempt status

Applying: Applications need to be submitted in order to receive benefits. To receive the

application form, either visit the city's home page, or contact the office below.

(They will send you the required forms by mail.)

Schedule: The office will begin processing applications in this category from March.

## The number of special benefit scams are on the rise!

Please exercise caution when talking about personal information, your bankbook, ATM cards, or pin numbers.

- Regarding this special allowance, local and national government officials will never ask to handle your personal bank accounts or ATM transactions.
- Local and national government officials will never charge handling fees, or ask for them to be paid via bank transfer.
- If you are subject to any suspicious phone calls, consult with others such as family members and friends, or contact the police.

## COVID-19 Vaccination: Scheduling for Booster shots (3<sup>rd</sup> shot)

Coupons for the booster shots will be sent to individuals once it has been six months since their 2<sup>nd</sup> shot. For those who do not receive their coupons, even though it has been more than six months, please reapply. ## Has your child's school enrollment notification arrived?

入学通知書は届きましたか(P7)

#### \* Children with foreign nationality

If you would like to have your child enter a municipal elementary or junior high school from April 2022, please contact the BOE School Affairs Division (see below). You do not need to do this if you have already applied.

The remainder of this article primarily deals with children with Japanese nationality

At the end of January, the City sent school enrollment notifications to parents and guardians of children (with Japanese nationality) who will enter elementary or junior high school this April.

Enrollment notification nyūgaku tsūchi sho 入学通知書

The notification tells you which school your child will enter and when. Keep it and submit it to your child's designated school on April 1<sup>st</sup>. This is enrollment day, not the entrance ceremony day.

If you have not received the notification or have lost it, please contact the School Affairs Division of the Municipal Board of Education (see below).

#### ■ If you have moved

#### If you have moved to a different place in Hiroshima City

- If you register your change of address no later than Tuesday, March 15<sup>th</sup>, the City will send a notification to your new address.
- \* If you register on or after Wednesday, March 16<sup>th</sup>, you must go to the Citizens' Affairs Division (*Shimin Ka*) of your local ward office or branch office to receive your notification.

#### If you have moved out of Hiroshima City

Contact the board of education for your new neighborhood.

#### ■ Enrolling your child in a national, prefectural, or private school

You will need a **letter of acceptance** (*Nyūgaku shōdakusho*) issued by the school your child will enter. Submit this and the enrollment notification to the School Affairs Division of the BOE (see below) or the Citizens' Affairs Division (*Shimin Ka*) of your ward or branch office. You can also submit these to the elementary school written on the enrollment notification, or to your child's current elementary school.

### ■ Changing schools

If you have a valid reason why your child cannot attend their designated school (e.g., your family is moving within Hiroshima City after April), please consult the School Affairs Division of the BOE (see below).

#### **■** Financial assistance

If you are A, B or C in the following table, the City of Hiroshima can provide financial assistance for school study such as toward the cost of school supplies, school lunch, school excursion.

A	<ul> <li>Your child goes to one of the following, run by the City of Hiroshima:</li> <li>* an elementary school</li> <li>* a junior high school</li> <li>* the lower part of secondary school</li> <li>* a school for children with special needs (elementary or junior high section).</li> </ul>

However, if you are one of the following, the support that you can receive will be limited.

- You receive Public Assistance (Seikatsu Hogo).
- Your child attends a special needs school.
- You are A and live outside of Hiroshima City.
- You are B or C.

## Livelihood Support Centers: Kurashi Sapōto Sentā

経済的にお困りの人はご相談を(P3)

For various reasons, many residents find themselves facing a wide range of financial difficulties. To help with this problem, each of the city's 8 wards have devoted help centers (*Kurashi Sapōto Sentā*), where individuals can receive guidance to get them back on track.

#### Consultation is free. Confidentiality guaranteed.

With the help of a licensed social worker, individuals can get the feedback necessary to help solve their problems. Consultation services are available to residents who live within city limits and are experiencing financial difficulties. (Excludes individuals who are currently receiving public welfare (*Seikatsu Hogo*).)

Family members of the struggling individual can also come to the center to seek advice on their behalf. Support is offered to both individuals or family members, and is conducted on a personal level, to fit the needs of each person.

In order to use these services, you need to meet certain conditions regarding one's income and financial assets.
