Many parents can go through feelings of anxiety or uneasiness when taking care of their children. If that happens, know that you are not alone and don't be afraid to ask for help. Below, you can find information about support offered by the City of Hiroshima to parents.

Community Childcare Support Center (Chi'iki Kosodate Shien Sentā)

Community Childcare Support Centers are located in your local ward offices. Feel free to drop in for advice on childcare from public health nurses, childcare workers, and nutritionists.

Support services available

- Individual consultations available in-person and via telephone
- Information about events and gatherings where both children and families can interact with other children and families
- Seminars and lectures about childrearing

Childcare Open Spaces

Childcare Open Spaces are places for children and families to gather and interact with other children and families. Activities and events held here are usually organized and carried out by local citizens and take place at community halls (*kōmin-kan*), children's community centers (*jidō-kan*), or meeting places (*shūkaisho*). Several times a year, these open spaces welcome public nurses, nutritionists, or childcare workers from the Childcare Support Center to offer childcare guidance. Everyone is welcome to join events; for information about when and where Childcare Open Spaces will be available, please inquire at your local Community Childcare Support Center (details above).

Monthly Health Guidance

During these monthly meetings, health nurses or childcare workers from the Childcare Support Center perform infant health checks and offer childcare advice to parents. This is a great service to help alleviate any anxieties you may have about parenting. No reservations necessary! For information on when and where health guidance meetings will be held, please contact your local Community Childcare Support Center (details above). Be sure to bring your Maternal and Child Health Handbook (*Boshi Kenkō Techō*) and a towel (necessary for the infant health check) with you when participating.

Childcare Support Handbook: Anshin Kosodate Support Book

Please note that this handbook is in Japanese.

Find useful information regarding childcare services, such as temporary care services at nursery schools, and how to apply for nursery schools and kindergarten. Also contains information on where to find advice from healthcare professionals and consultation services.

Childcare Support App: Boshimo

This digital service is available in 12 different languages (Japanese, English, Chinese (traditional and simplified), Korean, Portuguese, Spanish, Tagalog, Thai, Vietnamese, Indonesian, Russian, and Nepali).

Boshimo is a maternal and child health handbook app that provides helpful information on childcare.

What you can do with this app:

- Receive local childcare information
- Search local clinics, nursing schools, kindergartens, parks, etc.
- Keep a record of your child's development
- Manage vaccination records

Applications for April 2024 enrollment in after-school childcare

来年度の放課後児童クラブの利用申し込み 「ひろしま市民と市政」|2月|日号(P4)

Hōkago Jidō Clubs (Afterschool Childcare) are for elementary school students whose parents need childcare services after school and meet certain criteria.

Who is eligible?

Parents or guardians who are not at home due to work etc., and need regular childcare after school for elementary school children until around 5 pm.

- Children who can use this service will be selected from a pool of applications.
- For children whose parents or guardians are employed, their parents or guardians can apply for this service when they are away for work at least 4 days/week.
- For more information about requirements, please contact the Municipal Board of Education.

How to apply

Apply directly to the *jidō-kan* (Children's Community Center) or *Hōkago Jidō Club* to use this service for the year. Please contact them before you visit.

Preventing traffic accidents

Reports of fatal traffic accidents caused by motorcycles and bicycles are on the rise. As motorcycles and bicycles are less visible behind cars and trucks, pay close attention when riding motorcycles or bicycles in order to prevent collisions. Always ride slowly around curves and slow down and stop at intersections to watch for oncoming traffic.

Follow safety rules and etiquette, and always ride responsibly to prevent accidents.

Pedestrians

- \cdot Use pedestrian crosswalks when crossing.
- Obey traffic signals, look left and right for oncoming traffic.
- \cdot Wear reflectors or have a light when walking at night or when visibility is poor.

Elderly drivers

Changes in physical and mental conditions take place as we get older, and our ability to drive safely is affected by these changes. Try to understand how aging can affect driving and what you can do to respond to these changes in order to continue driving safely.

🚴 Bicyclists

- Bicycles are vehicles. Follow the same rules and responsibilities as those who drive cars and other automobiles.
- \cdot Obey traffic rules and wear a helmet when riding.

NEVER drink and drive, do not let those who have been drinking drive

- It is illegal to drive under the influence of alcohol. Drunk driving may cause serious accidents.
- Alcohol affects driving ability and impairs your ability to think. NEVER drink and drive. It is also illegal to drink and ride your bicycle. NEVER let anyone who has been drinking drive or ride bicycles/motorcycles.

COVID-19 Vaccination Booster

新型コロナワクチンの接種を実施しています

The COVID-19 updated booster at group vaccination sites ended in December 2023. Beginning in January 2024, you can only receive vaccines at medical facilities offering individual vaccinations. Please confirm with the medical facility where you want to receive your vaccine for details.

Who can receive a booster shot?

Booster shots are available to individuals aged 6 months or older who have completed the 1st dose of the vaccine. One shot per person.

とんど (Tondo)・左義長 (さぎちょう // Sagichō)

Tondo Matsuri is a bonfire festival which usually takes place on January 15. People bring their new year ornaments to burn in a bonfire while wishing for good health and prosperity for the year. New year ornaments include decorative pines *(kadomatsu)*, new year decorations *(shimekazari)*, and new year calligraphy *(kakizome)*.

This traditional custom was originally called *sagicho*, but there are many different names for this traditional event and each local area has its own name, such as *Tondo-yaki* or *Dondo*. In Hiroshima, it is commonly known as *Tondo*.

In Japan, it's believed that the gods known as *Toshigami* visit each home during the New Year season, providing good luck. New year decorations are made to welcome *Toshigami* at the beginning of the year and are displayed at the doors to homes, expressing to the gods that the home is ready to welcome them.

It is said that *Toshigami* return to sky in the flames of bonfires. The larger flames are, the more happiness is on the way. Besides burning the previous year's new year decorations, people also roast mochi rice cakes and eat them while wishing for good health, as well as burn new year calligraphy writings while wishing for improved handwriting.

We hope you enjoyed all the different traditional New Year events for 2024!
