Useful Japanese daily rules and customs Getting ready for school **Featured words:** School supplies ランドセル School backpack Randoseru 文房具 **School supplies** Bunbōgu 筆箱 Pencil case Fude-bako お道具箱 School supply case (Usually for things other than writing utensils) Odōgu-bako 連絡帳袋 School notice case (For notices from the school) Renrakuchō-bukuro 算数セット **Arithmetic tools** (For first and second year elementary school students) Sansū setto School lunch kit In Japan, almost all elementary schools provide school 給食袋 給食袋 lunch (kyūshoku). Students eat lunch together in their classrooms and take turns serving school lunch while Kyūshoku-bukuro wearing an apron and kerchief. Students keep their lunch kit in their own bag. Gym uniform 体操服 Sometimes called *taisogi*; bags for gym uniforms are Taisōfuku known as taisofuku-bukuro.

	Red & white colored cap
赤白帽 Aka-shiro-bō	Students wear this cap in physical education class and school athletic meets. The colors of the cap are used to divide students into teams: the red (<i>aka</i>) team and the white (<i>shiro</i>) team.
ぞうきん Zōkin	Cleaning rag
上履き Uwabaki	Indoor shoes In Japanese schools, there are areas (such as the gymnasium) where students take off outdoor shoes and change into indoor shoes. They keep their own indoor shoes within a shoe bag called <i>uwabaki-bukuro</i> .

These are just a few of the things your child will need when they enroll in elementary school.
